Bed & Bath Log-cabin chic

Lodgepole pine trim in the bath, above, echoes the intricate log detailing of the master bedroom, right, in a summer retreat built high in the Colorado Rockies. The original residence, an ordinary cabin, was remodeled into a showplace where traditional log architecture and split-pole pine detailing energize every room. In the bedroom, master carpenter Steve Cappellucci began the rustic look on the ceiling with a wainscot finish that gives the whole room a warm glow. He repeated the wainscoting in the bay window, where a cozy window seat was carved out, and then embellished windows and window seat with a "frame" and trim of split poles. To warm up the bedroom even more, Fort Worth designer Joe Minton chose a russet *mille fleurs* wallcovering and friendly patchwork for bedspread and window seat cushion. More of Cappellucci's handwork appears in the bathroom where the whirlpool tub is set into a wainscot surround. Fine lodgepole detailing makes the room distinctive, right down to the door "molding" and whimsically shaped mirror.
